Seed Bomb Craft

Bees are incredible creatures, and one of the most interesting things about them is that flowers are all they truly need to survive! With loss of food being one of the main issues these pollinators run into, let's make "seed bombs" to grow more flowers!

MATERIALS:

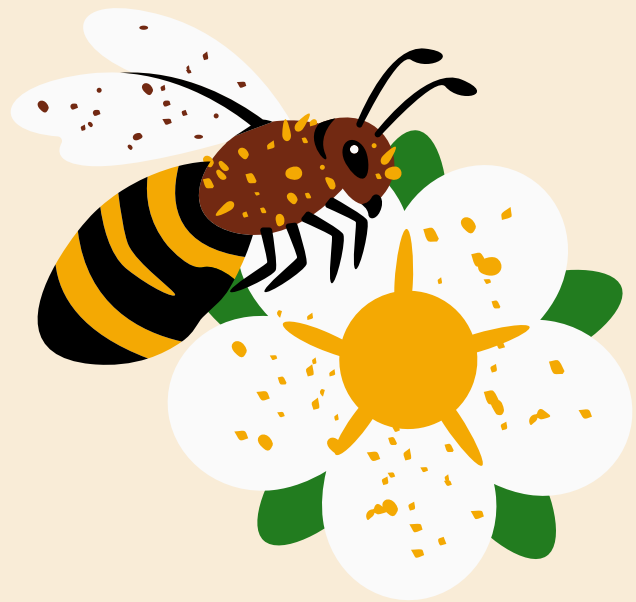
NATIVE SEEDS*

SOIL MIX

CLAY

CUPS OR PLATES

SMALL PAPER BAGS



1. First set out two cups for each group of children participating
2. Fill one cup with seeds and the other with soil mix
3. Begin passing small chunks of clay, having the students roll each into a ball
4. Have each student roll the clay into the potting soil and after roll the same ball into the seed mix
5. To keep seeds on, advise students to squish the seeds into the clay
6. place created seed bombs into take home bags
7. Students can then throw the seed bomb in their backyard or parks. The clay will melt away over time and the seeds will grow where the student threw the seed bomb.
